Ex Parte Communication

On behalf of the Fixed Wireless Communications Coalition (FWCC), pursuant to Section 1.1206(b)(1) of the Commission's Rules, I am electronically filing this written *ex parte* communication.¹

The FWCC concurs with and supports the comments filed yesterday by IDT Spectrum, Inc., which holds LMDS Block B licenses at 31.0-31.3 GHz.

IDT points out that a requirement for newly reduced emissions in the 31.3-31.5 GHz band would adversely impact the immediately adjacent LMDS licenses. The technical

difficulties of implementing these lower emissions will inevitably raise equipment costs and may further delay Block B deployment. The unexpected burdens would unfairly reduce the value of LMDS licenses, whose prices were set by the market long before the Commission gave any hint of the proposed restrictions.

In view of these considerations, the FWCC submits that adoption of the proposal is not in the public interest.
