**Re: WT Docket No. 10-153, Amendment of Part 101 to Facilitate Wireless Backhaul

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Wednesday, January 11, 2017, Mitchell Lazarus and Cheng-yi Liu of Fletcher, Heald & Hildreth, PLC, as counsel for the Fixed Wireless Communications Coalition, Inc. (FWCC), met with Blaise Scinto, John Schauble, Peter Daronco, Brian Wondrack, Stephen Buenzo, and Christopher Andes (last two by telephone) of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau's Broadband Division to discuss the FWCC's positions in the above-referenced docket with respect to the Fixed Service (FS) issues listed below.

On each topic below we very briefly reiterated the views previously set out in the FWCC's pleadings without presenting any new data or arguments.

- support of rule changes to allow 2-foot category B antennas in the 13 GHz band
- support for clarification of 47 C.F.R. § 101.103 and/or 101.115(f) on correcting interference by reducing EIRP at 11 GHz
- opposition to intermediate antenna upgrades between Category B and A
- support for wider channels in the 3.7 – 4.2 GHz band
- support of Mimosa's proposal for wider channels in the 23 GHz band
- support for broader conditional authority in the 23 GHz band and expedited Federal/non-Federal coordination

- support for rule changes to permit smaller antennas in the 71-76/81-86 GHz bands (category B) and a waiver pending the rulemaking
- support for an amendment of the 71-76/81-86 GHz rules to require construction notifications and allow amending of registrations
- opposition to abolishing the Category B minimum antenna standards
- support for private users sharing with federal users at 7125-8500 MHz
- support for service rules at 102-109.5 GHz
